## MAJOR AREAS OF RESEARCH INTEREST

Research Areas: Socio-determinants of health, health disparities, role of culture in health

Methods: Community-based participatory research (CBPR), Mixed methods approaches

1. Health Disparities: I conduct research in cancer prevention and control with communities to ensure deep level community engagement, utilizing principles of participatory research that engages communities from conceptualization through dissemination. My career has been devoted to generating effective community-academic partnerships to work together on innovative community issues and solutions that are relevant to these communities. My research on health disparities evaluates effectiveness of interventions, cultural relevance and appropriateness, literacy, numeracy, among other. I work on the creation of capacity building programs in academic and community settings broadly, upholding principles of beneficence and community benefits to provide support in health improvements led by and supported at the community level. Research interests include translational research and conduct of randomized control trials in cancer prevention and control to reduce/eliminate health disparities. Also engaged in health communication research, using storytelling (narrative) to transform knowledge, attitudes, and behaviors in women's cancers to correct health disparities in vulnerable populations at the community level. Multiple publications and research contracts and awards have resulted from this multidisciplinary research that cuts across various disciplines and campuses at USC.

2. Sociodeterminants of health research: my research interest includes work on substance abuse prevention including tobacco prevention and control with an emphasis on health disparities and social determinants of health in vulnerable populations at the community level. More recently with the COVID-19 pandemic I pivoted my CBPR research to ensure we would understand and address the various determinants of health that influenced vaccine adoption, hesitancy and influenced misinformation on COVID. These areas of research have yielded multiple publications, research contracts and awards have resulted from this multidisciplinary effort. Three NIH tobacco and substance abuse prevention Centers have resulted from this effort.

3. Community-based and Empowerment Research Interests: My research interest includes development and testing of culturally relevant educational interventions and educational materials, and the use of new technology to reduce obesity via community and youth empowerment, and lower cardiovascular disease risk as well as approach multiple risk factors for chronic disease prevention. This work is done using community based participatory models, empowerment frameworks and a mixed methods approach. This area of research has resulted in multiple research centers awards working directly with community based organizations, including the Clinical Translation Science Institute (CTSI), and two obesity related centers.
